Greenhouse is an Accelerator Program that over the course of twenty years has helped hundreds of Columbia students launch their businesses and prepare for subsequent investment by providing mentorship, guidance, funding for prelaunch expenses, access to experts in key fields and opportunities to present their startups to professional investors.

Participants are required to (a) define goals and (b) required to make weekly progress and communicate it throughout the semester. Along the way, each team receives mentorship from experienced founders, venture capitalists, angel investors, venture lawyers, technology experts and others along the way. Greenhouse also helps many students prepare for application to the Eugene Lang Entrepreneurial Initiative Fund, the Columbia Startup Lab and outside accelerator programs such as yCombinator and Techstars.
